Organizational Overview.

The Amos Ngumbi Foundation is a registered community-based non-profit organization operating in Kenya, with its main focus on the Kibwezi East Sub-County and its environs. The Foundation is committed to enhancing the quality of life of disadvantaged communities through effective, community-led, and sustainable last-mile service delivery.

Since its inception, the Foundation has undertaken multi-sectoral development programs to address poverty, water shortages, food insecurity, limited access to education and health services, youth unemployment, and economic marginalization. During the 2020-2021 period alone, the Foundation impacted tens of thousands of beneficiaries across various thematic areas.

Programmatic Portfolio & Impact (2020–2021)

YOUTH & WOMEN EMPOWERMENT

The Foundation supports economic self-reliance through income-generating activities, financial inclusion models (including table banking), and group savings structures.

Key Achievements:

- Over 3,000 women supported through empowerment initiatives in 2020
- Strengthened self-help groups across Kibwezi East (Mang'ele–Ivingoni/Nzambani Ward)
- Strategic consultations with women group leaders
- Target to reach 10,000 women and youth in subsequent years





BODABODA EMPOWERMENT INITIATIVE

Recognizing motorcycle transport as a major source of youth employment, the Foundation supports safety, professionalism, and financial inclusion within the sector.

Interventions Include:

- Road safety sensitization
- Planned distribution of reflector jackets
- Linkages to licensing and insurance services
- Promotion of SACCO membership

This initiative enhances income stability while reducing road safety risks.

YOUTH MENTORSHIP, SPORTS & TALENT DEVELOPMENT

The Foundation identifies and nurtures youth talent in sports and connects young people to mentorship opportunities.

Impact:

- Over 40 football and volleyball teams supported
- Distribution of sports equipment (jerseys, balls, nets, pumps)
- Increased youth engagement in structured sporting activities
- Promotion of sports as a pathway for economic and social empowerment



FAITH-BASED PARTNERSHIPS

Through collaboration with churches and mosques, the Foundation strengthens social support networks and community outreach.

Achievements:

- Support to church construction projects (e.g., cement donations)
- Provision of COVID-19 prevention materials to faith institutions
- Engagement in community religious events

These partnerships enhance grassroots reach and trust.





CIVIC EDUCATION & PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

The Foundation promotes inclusive governance and citizen engagement through sensitization forums and youth-focused engagement initiatives.

Focus Areas:

- Employment and economic opportunities
- Civic rights and responsibilities
- Health and education advocacy
- Youth participation in development planning

INFRASTRUCTURE DEVELOPMENT & SUPPORT

The Foundation invests in small-scale, high-impact infrastructure projects that improve economic connectivity and public health.

Key Projects:

- Rehabilitation of Kambu Bridge
- Grading and murraming of 10 KM of rural access roads
- Construction of a public toilet at Ngokolani Market

Impact:

- Improved access to markets and essential services
- Reduced transport risks during rainy seasons

ACCESS TO CLEAN DRINKING WATER

To address chronic water scarcity, the Foundation invests in sustainable water infrastructure.

Achievements:

- Drilling and commissioning of the Selewa Borehole
- Reduced time spent fetching water
- Improved household health outcomes

Future Plan:

- Drill 7 additional boreholes across four wards



FOOD SECURITY & POVERTY ALLEVIATION

The Foundation provides targeted support to vulnerable households, especially during crises.

Impact:

- 2,000 residents supported with food baskets in 2020
- Target of 5,000 beneficiaries in subsequent years
- Focus on widows, widowers, elderly persons, and vulnerable families

SANITARY TOWELS SUPPORT PROGRAM

This program promotes dignity, school attendance, and reproductive health among girls and women.

Impact:

- Over 500 girls and women supported
- Target of 10,000 beneficiaries in subsequent years

DISASTER MANAGEMENT & HUMANITARIAN RESPONSE

The Foundation responds rapidly to emergencies affecting communities.

Example:

- Emergency support to flood-affected families in Kikunduku Village

EDUCATION SUPPORT PROGRAM

The Foundation improves access to quality education through bursaries and learning support.

Achievements:

- Over 500 students supported with bursaries
- Distribution of learning materials to KCPE candidates
- Support to teachers' welfare initiatives
- Target of 2,000 additional students

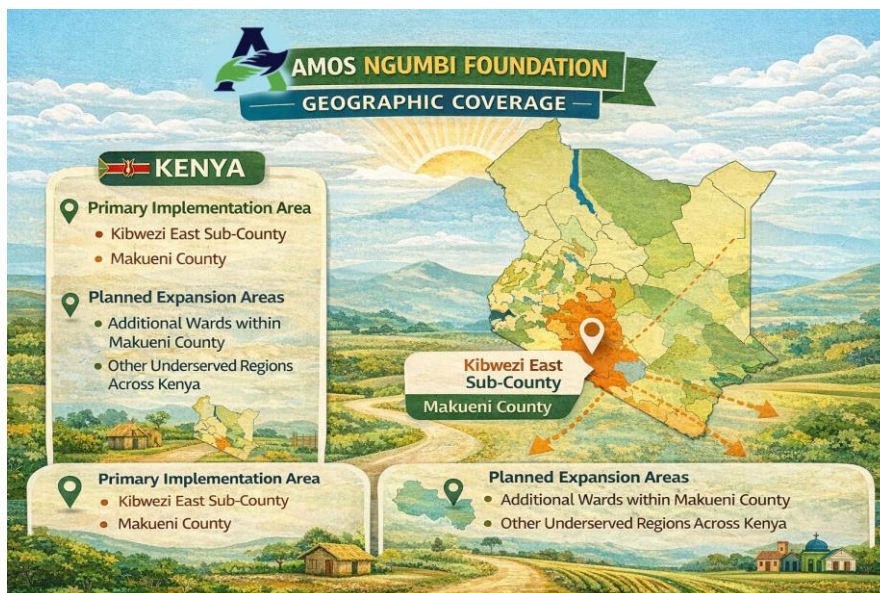
During the pandemic, the Foundation provided large-scale protective support.

Key Achievements:

- Donation of over 70,000 face masks, sanitizers, and handwashing stations
- Support to health facilities, markets, schools, and county offices
- Participation in National Hygiene Program / Kazi Mtaani Phase II
